

Instructions for editing the poster

1 GETTING STARTED

- **Upload Images:** Drag and drop your logo files and graph images into the project file list (e.g., the left panel in Overleaf).
- **Find Sections:** The code is divided into numbered sections (e.g., 6. GRID, 7. HEADER). Use **Ctrl+F** (Windows) or **Cmd+F** (Mac) to search for them.

2 CHANGE TITLE & NAME (Go to Section 7)

1. Scroll down to **Section 7** in the code.
2. Look for the line containing POSTER TITLE. Delete the placeholder text and type your own title.
3. Look for Author One, Author Two. Type your names there.
4. **Logos:** Find the text example-image. Replace it with your exact logo filename (e.g., iitlogo.png).

3 PASTE YOUR TEXT (Go to Section 8)

1. Scroll down to **Section 8**. This is where the content boxes are defined.
2. Find a line that looks like this:

```

```

3. **Change the Title:** Edit the text 1. INTRODUCTION.
4. **Change the Text:** Delete Your text goes here... and paste your own content.
5. **Tips:**
 - Use \\ to force a new line.
 - Use \textbf{words} to make **bold text**.

4 INSERT AN IMAGE (Copy-Paste Code)

To put a picture inside a content box, copy and paste the code below into the content area where you want the image to appear:

```
\begin{center}
  % Change '150mm' to adjust the image height
  \includegraphics[width=\linewidth, height=150mm, keepaspectratio]{your_filename.jpg}
  \captionof{figure}{Write Caption Here}
\end{center}
```

5 RESIZE THE BOXES (Go to Section 6)

If your text doesn't fit or leaves too much empty space, scroll up to **Section 6**.

To make boxes **TALLER**:

- Find the variable for the row, e.g., `\hRowOne` (Top Row) or `\hRowTwoLeft` (Middle Row).
- Change the number (e.g., change 380mm to 420mm).
- **WARNING:** If you make the top row taller, you **must** make the middle or bottom row shorter. The total height of the poster is fixed!

To make columns **WIDER**:

- Find `\colLeft`. Increase the number (e.g., 500mm) to make the left column wider. The right column will shrink automatically.

Precaution

- Do **not** change the numbers inside the `\createbox{...}` lines. (Only edit Section 6 to change sizes).
- Do **not** delete the closing bracket `}` at the end of a box.
